Bestselling mystery-suspense novelist Scott Turow's *Limitations* (2006) captivated readers as a serial in *The New York Times Magazine* and will be published on November 14, 2006—just in time for his Portland appearance. A practicing attorney, Turow is also the author of *Presumed Innocent* (1987), *Burden of Proof* (1990) and *Ordinary Heroes* (2003).

Along with seven bestselling novels, Turow has published two books of nonfiction, including a memoir of his first year at Harvard Law School, *One L: The Turbulent True Story of a First Year at Harvard Law School* (1977), and a book of essays that tackle a key debate in American law, *Ultimate Punishment: A Lawyer's Reflections on Dealing with the Death Penalty* (2003).

Turow's books have won a number of literary awards, including the Heartland Prize and the Robert F. Kennedy Book Award. He continues to practice law and lives near Chicago.
